WE DISCUSSED THE PROS AND CONS OF MAKING OUR PHONE PATCH ACCESSIBLE WITH CODES ONLY. OF COURSE THE EMERGENCY NUMBERS WILL BE AVAILABLE

WITHOUT THE CODES!!! THIS ITEM WILL BE VOTED ON AT THE FEBRUARY MEETING AS WELL. ALSO THERE WILL BE ANOTHER REPEATER AT THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE FOR USE ON THE VALLEY FLOOR THAT WILL ALSO HAVE AN AUTO PATCH ON IT, THIS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO DO NOT CHOOSE TO BE PART OF THE I 46.720 REPEATER SYSTEM AS WELL AS TO THOSE WHO ARE.

IF YOU ARE STILL CONFUSED ABOUT THE FEES, THE \$25.00 PER FAMILY ACTIVATION FEE ORIGINALLY HELPED PAY FOR THE SYSTEM AND IS NOW HELPING TO KEEP IT IN GOOD ORDER. THE \$ 10.00 PER FAMILY ANNUAL FEE HELPS WITH THE COST OF THE PHONE AND EQUIPMENT TO KEEP IT UP AND RUNNING. IF YOU PAID THE \$25.00 FEE THIS YEAR, YOU DO NOT NEED TO PAY THE \$ 10,00 UNTIL NEXT YEAR. WE HAVE A TERRIFIC SYSTEM, BUT IF ANYTHING NEEDED TO BE REPLACED, IT WOULD COST MORE THAN WE NOW HAVE IN OUR ACCOUNTS. ALL THINGS COME WITH A PRICE, IF YOU ADD IT ALL UP, IT WOULD ONLY BE PENNIES PER DAY TO BE PART OF THIS SYSTEM. ASK YOURSELF IF THE CONVENIENCE AND COVERAGE IS WORTH IT, THEN COME TO THE FEBRUARY MEETING TO VOTE.

There is a little annoying sound amateurs monitoring repeaters hear all the time. What is that you ask? Well, tune in and you will hear it several times a day. It is "kerchunk." Ker-chunks are unidentified communications that bring up the repeater and open up the squelch on everyone's radio. No voice or intelligible sound is heard, just ker-chunk. Before you get your license, many of you will have already purchased a radio. There is a big temptation to turn it on and try it out. Of course you do not want to identify yourself in any way, so you just push the "push-to-talk" button and release it without saying a thing. You hear the repeater ker-chunk. Your radio works! Of course it works, but you just transmitted an unidentified signal and broke the law. If you want to test out your radio, have a licensed radio operator help you. They can do it legally and maybe show you a few things. Remember, you are responsible for the legal operation of your amateur station.
