# HAM PROFILE

You may scout around for quite a while to find one as dedicated in working in BSA as John Waldron KB7WET.

Presently a resident of Hyde Park, John claims the distinction of being born in our pineapple island state of Hawaii, prior to the onset WWII. A rather som-

ber experience was related of the family running for an air raid shelter when hostilities began in the bombing of Hickam Field on that memorable day in 1941, something we hope we never have to see again.

John has held his Tech ticket since '93 and has participated in such activities as LOTOJA several times, (he must have really found sonic bargains in Jackson), the bike races, and radio support for the snow-mobile races up north. He sports a Yaesu HT and base station with several mobile mag mounts and a Ringo Ranger antenna.

He must have homesteaded 9 or 10 places in Cache Valley, one being the family home on the present site of the Spectrum at USU, the old Schaub Grape Farm. Now how many of you remember that one?

He has the distinction of being associated with one of the oldest scout troops west of the Mississippi, Troop 1, undoubtedly the first one in Cache Valley. That was probably back when 'Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous & Kind' were just the beginning of the rest of the story.

He attended the Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico on several occasions and tells of an interesting situation when lie and numerous other hardy souls climbed bed to the top of 9,100' "Tooth of Time Peak" to participate in an early morning sunrise ceremony. 


### N7RRZ Repeater System

The N7RRZ repeater system at 449.325- PL 156.7 is located on the east bench of North Logan, at an elevation of 4475 ft. The Trustee & Owner Is Dave Fullmer (N7RRZ).

The System uses a Link Communications RLC-Club Controller, Motorola R1225 Transceiver, TX RX Systems #28-66-02 Duplexer & Band Pass Filter #11-66-0901, TE System 4552RA Power Amp (180 Watt) & #4420 Pre-Amp, Diamond X700HNA Antenna & Campbell Scientific Weather Station.









Features of the system includes an open autopatch, and a weather station with outside temp, wind speed, wind direction & barometric pressure. The coverage is around 60 miles.

### **Box Elder County Utah QSO Party**

There has been some confusion about the contest rules and several questions have been raised. In an effort to clarify, improve and hopefully enhance the participation in this contest, several changes and addition to the rules have been made.

This contest has been divided into three separate contests. The first contest is for Box Elder County stations only. Box Elder County stations may make contacts for contest credit with any other station anywhere. The second contest is for Utah stations (excluding Box Elder County stations) only. Utah stations make contacts for contest credit with any station outside the state of Utah and including stations in Box Elder County. The third contest is for stations outside of Utah only. These stations make contacts with any Utah station including Box Elder County Stations. These contacts can be made on any amateur band using any mode.

The date and contest period is from May 8, 1999 1400 z and ending May 11, 0600. You may work the entire period if you wish.

Exchange: For stations in Utah the exchange is Name, County and Call Sign. For stations outside of Utah give Name, QTH, and Call Sign. If operating at someone else's station use their call sign. Always use your own name. Log: mode, band, date, time, call sign of station worked, complete exchange sent (call sign, QTH and name), complete exchange received (call sign, QTH and name) and NCO/CO, if applicable.

If operating at a station with more than one operator give the name of each operator. Each name given counts as a contact for the receiving station.
