A letter of interest from Paul Hoth, KJ7RJ

When Logan City was approached regarding what would be required to erect a HF radio tower, Paul Hoth (KJ7RK) was told a "Special Use Permit" would be necessary. A "Special Use Permit" means presenting the matter before the Logan City Planning and Zoning Commission and all property owners within 300ft of the property wishing to erect the antenna tower. Paul estimates this is approximately 30 owners for his neighborhood.

An antenna tower review by the Planning and Zoning Commission and neighbors places the right for all Hams to erect a tower, for more efficient broadcasting, before public scrutiny without thorough technical and legal aspects being taken into consideration. Paul recognizes this matter is of his own choosing and fully accepts total responsibility for the outcome. However, Paul says if he is prohibited from erecting a tower or even restricted in height, a precedence will be set for Logan City and probably for all of Cache County with lingering consequences for all Hams wanting to erect an antenna tower in the future.

It is obvious this matter is of major importance to all Cache County Hams. As Paul sees it, a decision for him to erect a tower is likely to be based on personal opinion of the Planning and Zoning Commission and his neighbors unless there is a good representation from the Cache County Ham community present in the review meeting.

This matter is scheduled to be brought before the Logan City Planning and Zoning Commission on Thursday January 13, which is the same night as our next BARC Club Meeting. The Zoning meeting goes from 5 to 10 PM or until all scheduled business is finished. The exact time for the tower subject to be discussed is not known at this time. If the tower issue is first on the Planning and Zoning agenda, the meeting could be over in time for all who attend the Zoning meeting to attend the Club meeting, but if it gets scheduled for later on the agenda, there could be a meeting time conflict. According to Tyler, our Club President, there is important business that needs to be conducted at the January Club meeting.

Paul is not requesting anyone miss the January Club meeting, but since this matter could effect all Cache County Hams it is important enough for everyone to be informed of the situation. The decision to attend the Club meeting or the Logan City Planing and Zoning Meeting is up to each person individually. If you attend the Zoning Meeting, you don't need to worry about speaking unless you want to. Your attendance with HT in hand will send a 59 Signal report to all present. The estimated time the tower subject will come up for discussion will be announced in next week's NET.

The Zoning Meeting will be held in the Logan City Business building at 255 North Main St. in the Court Room across the Hall from the Logan City Library. If anyone wants more detail, please call me on the landline at 753-0750 or my email address is pbhoth@yahoo.com in all lower case letters.
