HAM PROFILE

If any one of you has lost your bearings(literally), we have just the person to set you straight. None other than our own Cache County Surveyor, Preston Ward,

KC7HYV. Preston has held a Tech plus license for 5 years and presently hails from Hyde Park. He was born in Billings Montana at a very early age, thence to Rupert Idaho, and finally found the spot in Hyde Park. He attended North Cach



attended North Cache briefly and then on to graduate from Sky View High School. He also served a mission in Foggy auld England in 70-72 where he managed to glimpse a bit of the countryside through the fog and drizzle. He next attended USU with a major in Civil Engineering which led him to his present position as Department Head of the Cache County Surveyors Office. Preston sports a 2 meter HT plus a 50 watt Kenwood 2 meter base station and J pole antenna at the home QTH. He spent about 10 years in the CAP, where he was involved in several searches for downed aircraft and lost people in the mountains. Techniques involve skimming the peaks and trees with what is known as contour flying, sometimes about 200' off the deck, and requires a great deal of know how. Canyon flying provides some rather hairy experiences and is definitely not for those with vertigo or queasy stomachs. He related that aerial searches, especially with other aircraft in the vicinity have to be an organized proceedure, following designated grid area assignments with close radio contact with other
